

WERTHAN FAMILY BUSINESS IN NASHVILLE

1868 Meier Werthan began selling rags from a vendor cart in Nashville, TN.

1880's Began selling reconditioned Burlap and cotton bags.

1911 Company changes its name to Werthan Bag & Burlap.

World War I: Provided sand bags to the U.S. Army.

1922 Opened a small plant on Second Avenue.



1922 Opened a manufacturing facility on Clinton Street in the Old Marathon Motors Building.

1928 Opened operations at 8th Avenue North

Late 1930's Began producing "dress print" bags.

1950's: Began manufacturing multi-wall paper bags.

1968 Began manufacturing plastic bags.

1971 Honey's Auto Parts & Tennessee Auto Parts Warehouse opens.

1971 Check Printers opens.

1980 Honey's Auto Parts & Tennessee Auto Parts Warehouse sold.



1999: Check Printers sold.

2002 Werthan Granite opens.

2006 Werthan Tile opens.

2011 Werthan Granite and Werthan Tile merge to become Werthan.
